- **Description-** Anti-diuretic hormone with strong vasopressor properties. It may also precipitate AMI or Anginal episodes.
- **Indications-** Increase peripheral vascular resistance in arrest (CPR) or to control bleeding from esophageal varices.
- **Contraindications-** Contraindicated in patients with Chronic nephritis with nitrogen retention, ischemic heart disease, PVCs, advanced arteriosclerosis, or 1st stage of labor (dilation).
- **Precautions-** Epilepsy, migraines, heart failure, angina, vascular disease, hepatic impairment, elderly, and children.
- **Supplied-** Usually supplied in 20 Unit Vials. Requires two for the Adult Cardiac Arrest dose.
- **Dosage / Route-** Cardiac Arrest (VF/VT) 40 Units IV Esophageal Varices- 0.2 to 0.4 units / minute IV drip
