Name / Classification: Mannitol (Osmitrol) Osmotic Diuretic

Indications: Cerebral Edema

**Contraindications:** Hypersensitivity, Pulmonary Edema, CHF, Organic CNS disease, Intercranial bleeding, shock, severe dehydration.

**Side Effects:** Headache, tremor, convulsions, dizziness, transient muscle rigidity, edema, CHF, angina-like pain, hypotension, hypertension, thrombophlebitis, blurred vision, dry mouth, nausea, vomiting, diuresis, urinary retention, nephrosis, fluid and electrolyte imbalance.

Dosage / Route:	Adult-	1.5 to 2.0 grams / kg slow IV
	Pediatric-	0.25 to 0.5 grams / kg over 60 minutes

Name/ Classification: Dexamethasone (Decadron) Steroid

**Indications:** To reduce the inflammatory processes in allergic reactions such as anaphylaxis, asthma, and COPD; to reduce cerebral / spinal cod edema.

**Contraindications:** No absolute contraindications in the emergency setting. Relative contraindications include acute infections, systemic fungal infections, tuberculosis, varicella, or vaccinioa or live vaccine.

**Precautions:** Use with caution in stromal herpes simplex, kertitus, GI ulceration, renal disease, diabetes melitis, hypothyroidism, myasthenia gravis, CHF, cirrhosis, psychic disorders, seizures.

**Side Effects:** Euphoria, insomnia, convulsions, increased, ICP, vertigo, headache, psychic disturbances, CHF, hypertension, edema, menstrual irregularities, hyperglycemia, increased intraocular pressure, glaucoma, nausea, increased appetite, heartburn, weakness, loss of muscle mass, fractures,

Dosage / Route:	Adult- 4.0 to 24 mg IV/IM
	Pediatric- 0.5 to 1.0 mg/kg
